

# About Transthoracic Echocardiogram

An echocardiogram (also called cardiac ultrasound) is an ultrasound scan of the heart, which involves you lying on a bed while the sonographer takes moving and still images of your heart. High frequency sound waves are sent through the probe on your chest to show a real-time image of your heart on a screen. It gives the Cardiologist information about your heart and valve function while at rest.

## Preparation

- 1. Wear comfortable loose-fitting clothes that can be easily removed from the chest area. (A top with shorts, pants or skirts would be best, rather than a dress).
- 2. You can bring a chaperone if needed.
- 3. Take your medications as usual on the day of the test.
- 4. You don't need to fast before this test.
- 5. Bring a list of your medications with you.

### What to expect

You will need to remove the clothing from your chest, but you will be covered as needed. You will then lie down on a bed and ECG electrodes will be placed on your chest. You will lie on your left side most of the time during the scan.

Ultrasound gel is used to improve contact and imaging quality, so your chest will get wet from the gel. The hard ultrasound probe will be put firmly against your chest wall to take the pictures. Several sites are used: the left side of the chest beside the sternum (breastbone), the area under the left breast, the upper stomach and the base of the neck. You may hear noises that sound a bit like a washing machine. This represents the magnified ultrasound signal of blood flowing through the heart chambers and valves. This is completely normal. The scanning time will be about 40 minutes but can vary depending on the findings.

# Results

The Sonographer and the Cardiologist will write a report and send it to your referring Doctor. You should be able to talk with your Doctor about your results and discuss your next steps.
