

About Canberra Health Services

We offer high quality, effective, person-centred care. Our vision is 'creating exceptional health care together.'

We deliver a range of health services for people across the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) and surrounding Southern New South Wales (NSW) region.

Some of these services include, but are not limited to:

- Canberra Hospital, which provides trauma services and most major medical and surgical services
- North Canberra Hospital, which offers acute and sub-acute services
- University of Canberra Hospital, a rehabilitation facility that offers additional outpatient services
- Clare Holland House, which provides public palliative care services

- a network of nurse-led walk-in centres, which provide free health care for nonlife-threatening injuries and illnesses
- community health centres, providing general and specialist health services to people of all ages
- community based health services, such as early childhood services, youth and women's health, dental health, mental health and alcohol and drug services.

New and improved hospitals

Canberra is growing and so is Canberra Health Services (CHS).

Canberra Hospital, our main tertiary hospital, is being expanded with a new 44,000 square metre state-of-the-art Critical Services Building that will open in 2024.

The Critical Services Building will be home to a bigger emergency department with dedicated children's emergency area, more operating rooms, more treatment spaces, and more intensive care beds.

The new building will be one of Australia's newest and most technologically advanced health care facilities. It will have the latest in specialised medical imaging equipment, automated dispensing cabinets to support accurate and timely distribution of medicines, a centralised sterilising services unit and a pathology tube system within the emergency department. It will also have an intraoperative magnetic resonance imaging suite, three new cardiac cath labs, including a hybrid cardiac laboratory and an electrophysiology laboratory, increased inpatient rehabilitation services with two new gyms and more purpose-built spaces for bariatric patients.

The building's contemporary design will enable the latest innovations in health care to support our committed and skilled workforce. It will also have better amenities for all CHS team members, regardless of whether you are or are not physically located within the building. These amenities include a 24/7 café, courtyards, gardens and shops.

The ACT Government has also committed to building another new public hospital on the northside of Canberra, with construction to commence mid-decade. This new hospital will be built on the existing North Canberra Hospital site and operated by CHS.

Team member benefits

Work-life balance

Salary packaging

You can salary package pre-tax dollars from your salary towards:

- portable electronic devices (conditions apply).

In addition, as an employee in an Eligible Public Hospital and Ambulance (EPHA) position, you do not have to pay Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) on a number of ordinarily taxable items. This exemption applies to taxable items with a grossed-up value of up to \$17,000 per annum. This can be used for:

- own home mortgage
- private home rental
- personal loan
- employee benefits card.
